# **Outlook Review:** TC development & anomalous precipitation during the past week

### ENSO: (Aug 11, 2022 Update) next update on Thursday, Sep 8<sup>th</sup>

- ENSO Alert System Status: El Niño Advisory
- La Niña is expected to continue, with chances for La Niña gradually decreasing from 86% in the coming season to 60% during Dec-Feb 2022-23.

#### MJO and other subseasonal tropical variability:

- Following a brief uptick of the MJO signal over the Indian Ocean during late August, the MJO quickly weakened in early September where it continues to shift eastward over the Maritime Continent at a low amplitude.
- While RMM forecasts are unsupportive of a more coherent MJO reemerging during the next 3 weeks, upperlevel velocity potential forecasts favor a secondary envelope of enhanced conditions developing over the Western Hemisphere that may help aid in the reorganization of the MJO later in September.
- Given these conditions, the large-scale environment is expected to be favorable for additional tropical cyclogenesis across the Pacific and Atlantic basins.

# 200-hPa Velocity Potential Anomaly Maps:

A secondary envelope of enhanced conditions is favored during week-1 over the Americas, while the main convective envelope remains anchored over the eastern Hemisphere.

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• By week-3, the a wave-1 pattern is favored to redevelop, suggestive of the renewal of a more coherent MJO.



# **RMM Index Observations & Forecasts:**



- Unlike the GEFS and CFS, the ECMWF favors a continual circumnavigation of the intraseasonal signal that returns to the Western Hemisphere and Indian Ocean during the next 3 weeks, albeit at a low amplitude. This evolution is also favored by the latest BOMM RMM forecast (not pictured).
- However, ensemble spread remains quite high among the dynamical models, contributing to much uncertainty in the outlook.
